IN MEMORIAM

TASHA CENGEL '26, an electrical and computer engineering major, passed away March 25, 2025.

Remembered by her family as a passionate advocate for people in distress, Cengel intently and actively sought ways to help others. In lieu of birthday gifts for her sixth birthday, which came on the heels of a devastating earthquake in Haiti, she asked friends and family members to make donations to a charitable organization that was providing relief to affected families.

Cengel, who was born on Earth Day, loved nature and was active in scouting. She earned the rank of Eagle Scout just before she turned 18. At Lafayette College, Cengel pursued her passion for practical science by studying electrical and computer engineering.

Cengel's funeral was held Monday, March 31, 2025. A memorial gathering was held in her honor on the Lafayette College campus Saturday, April 26, 2025, where friends, faculty, and others shared stories and memories about Cengel.

EDWARD J. KERNS, Eugene H. Clapp II '36 Professor Emeritus of Art, passed away October 20, 2025.

He earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts from Richmond Professional Institute (now Virginia Commonwealth University), as well as a Master of Fine Arts from Maryland Institute College of Art. Kerns joined the faculty as associate professor in 1980, and he was promoted to full professor in 1986 and Eugene H. Clapp II Professor of Art in 1988, becoming the youngest person to hold an endowed chair in the College's history. He served as head of the Department of Art from 1980 to 1988, 1996 to 1999, and 2019 to 2022. Kerns also served as the founding director of the Williams Visual Arts Building from 2000 to 2007.

In addition to teaching a wide variety of art courses at all levels, Kerns engaged in collaborative teaching and groundbreaking research partnerships with neuroscientists, biologists, computer scientists, and civil, mechanical, and chemical engineers, and he advised a number of honors students not only in the Art Department, but also in the Biology, English, and Neuroscience departments.

Kerns was an established American abstract expressionist working in Manhattan when he was hired by Lafayette College to chair and build a modern-era Art Department. An internationally recognized painter, Kerns led the effort to establish the Williams Arts Campus, home to Lafayette's studio arts program. Additionally, he led the planning for

the establishment of the Williams Visual Arts Building and the downtown Arts Campus. His fundamental principles for these new educational enterprises were collaborative work with science and engineering, and working toward an intellectual, consilient unity of purpose. The last 15 years of his practice were devoted to art and science collaborations, including the *Octopus Meditations*, *Frankenstein2029* with Suzanne Westfall, and partnerships with consciousness study programs.

Since 1971, Kerns' work was seen in 42 one-person exhibits and over 130 group exhibitions. His works also are in numerous public and corporate collections, including those of the Aldrich Museum, AT&T Corporation, Chase Manhattan Bank, Citicorp Bank, Prudential Insurance Co., and more. In addition, Kerns served on museum boards and advised art-driven economic development projects, and he contributed to the publication of several exhibition catalogs.

Kerns received two Lindback Distinguished Teaching Awards as well as the James E. Lennertz Prize for Exceptional Teaching and Mentoring, James P. Crawford Award, Thomas Roy and Lura Forrest Jones Award for superior teaching, Thomas Roy and Lura Forrest Jones Faculty Lecture Award, and Mary Louise Van Arts Dalen Award for Superior Scholarship and Professional Activity. He received numerous grants for support of his works. Kerns was a member of the Pennsylvania Arts Coalition, College Art Association, and National Association for Curricular Development, and served as a member of the National Council of Art Administrators and Pennsylvania State Council on the Arts. He also served as chairman of the board for the Karl Stirner Arts Trail (KSAT) from 2010 to 2016, a role to which he returned in 2020. Kerns greatly contributed to the KSAT's founding mission. In 2024, Kerns earned a certificate of commendation from Easton Mayor Sal Panto for his contributions to the KSAT. As a teacher and as an artist, he gave Lafayette a tremendous model of how to be a teacher-scholar in the creative arts. Kerns retired from Lafayette in 2022 after 42 years of service to the College.

Kerns is survived by his daughter, Whitney; two granddaughters, Peyton Éibhleann Proud and Callie Joy Proud; and brother, Bill Kerns. He was honored with a panel discussion, film screening, and celebration of life at Lafayette College, as well as a tour of the KSAT, in March 2026.

RETIRING FACULTY ELECTED TO EMERITUS STATUS

JEFFREY D. HELM, associate professor of mechanical engineering, has been a member of the faculty for 24 years.

He earned a Bachelor of Arts in theater from Lehigh University, an Associate of Science in engineering science from Hudson Valley Community College, and a Bachelor of Science, Master of Science, and doctoral degree in mechanical engineering from University of South Carolina. Helm joined the faculty as an assistant professor in 2002 and was tenured and promoted to associate professor in 2010. He served as head of the Mechanical Engineering Department for seven semesters from 2014 to 2020.

Helm taught a variety of courses in mechanical engineering, including Statics, Dynamics, Manufacturing and Design, Thermodynamics, and Thermal/Fluid Systems. He was instrumental in his work with colleagues in building and shipping experiments that facilitated remote instruction during the pandemic. He demonstrated his creativity and engagement when he led students in a Senior Project to compete in an electric formula car competition. Helm has also demonstrated a solid commitment in mentoring his students, even having worked with one student to develop robotic actors for the College's theater production of *Heddatron*.

Helm has engaged in several research interests, but most of his research is in the development and application of a surface displacement measurement: digital image correlation, and the development of a method to determine three-dimensional movements from a single camera. He also has done contract work with the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation in precast bridge deck panel testing. His work included collaborations with six Lafayette colleagues. He has published 20 peer-reviewed journal articles, three book chapters, and has participated in dozens of conference proceedings.

Helm has a distinguished service record at the College, including leading the Mechanical Engineering Department's ABET assessment. He is a recognized leader at the College, having served as chair of the Faculty Academic Policy Committee and the Ad Hoc Committee on Expansion. He has also served on the College Budget and Planning Committee, among others. He has worked with the Lafayette Theater Department on 13 theater presentations. A leader in the profession, Helm has served as both the editor-in-chief and the associate editor for *Experimental Techniques*, and he was an executive board member of the Society of Experimental Mechanics. He was the recipient of their F. G. Tatnall Award in recognition of long and distinguished service.

CLIFFORD A. REITER, professor of mathematics, has been a member of the faculty for 42 years.

He earned a Bachelor of Science in mathematics from Bucknell University, a Master of Science degree from Rutgers University, and a doctoral degree from Pennsylvania State University. Reiter joined the faculty as an instructor in 1983, promoted to assistant professor in 1984, tenured and promoted to associate professor in 1989, and promoted to professor in 1999.

Reiter has been an effective teacher having taught several different courses in the mathematical sciences, including Calculus, Number Theory, Linear Algebra, Discrete Structures, and Differential Equations. He has demonstrated an unwavering dedication to the mentorship of EXCEL Scholars, Posse Scholars, and the NSF-funded Research Experiences for Undergraduates program.

Reiter's research interests include mathematical visualization, dynamics, number theory, computer language, and algorithm implementation. His publication records contain an impressive number of student co-authors, who often present their work at conferences. Reiter and a student demonstrated the existence of perfect parallelepipeds, solving a 30-year-old problem that resulted in a number of articles. Reiter's scholarship record is one of active and productive engagement with well over 50 published articles in the areas of number theory and mathematical visualization. He has written four editions of his book, *Fractals, Visualization, J*, with the fifth edition currently in progress, and co-authored *APL with a Mathematical Accent*.

Reiter has served as a member of the Faculty Academic Policy Committee and the Diversity Committee, and as adviser for the Outdoors Club. Reiter is active within his profession, serving as a referee for papers in *Symmetry (MDPI)*, *The American Mathematical Monthly*, *Fractals*, *Applied Mathematics and Computation*, *Mathematics (mdpi)*, and *The Fibonacci Quarterly*.

JOHN S. SHAW III, associate professor of psychology, has been a member of the faculty for 29 years.

He earned a Bachelor of Arts from Vanderbilt University, a J.D. from Stanford Law School, and an M.A. and Ph.D. from University of California, Los Angeles. Shaw joined the faculty as an assistant professor in 1997 and was promoted to associate professor in 2002. He served as head of the Department of Psychology from 2008 to 2009 and from 2016 to 2019. He also served as assistant head from 2002 to 2008 and from 2009 to 2016.

Shaw has been the recipient of eight Student Government Superior Teaching Awards, as well as the Lindback Distinguished Teaching Award, the James P. Crawford Award, the Marquis Distinguished Teaching Award, the Thomas Roy and Lura Forrest Jones Lecture Award, the James E. Lennertz Prize for Exceptional Teaching and Mentoring, and the Faculty All-Star Award. He has an impressive teaching record and is known for his contagious enthusiasm and humor in all of his courses. He has mentored numerous students, including serving as primary faculty adviser on 35 honors theses, second reader on 27 honors theses, and outside reader on 22 honors theses. He has also supervised dozens of advanced research and independent study projects, all while actively engaging in innovative pedagogy across the curriculum.

Shaw has consistently demonstrated an active scholarly program, authoring three novels and engaging in a variety of academic activities, including lectures, mock classes, and conference presentations. In addition, he has had a commendable record of dedicated service over the decades.

He chaired the Department of Psychology's assessment committee and participated in numerous faculty and staff searches. For the College, he served as the faculty meeting parliamentarian for 18 years, participated in countless admissions and student orientation events, and served on numerous College committees, including the College Budget Planning Committee, Appeal and Grievance Committee, Student Conduct Appeal Board, Institutional Review Board, and Presidential Working Group on Enrollment Size. He also served as a faculty associate on the Board of Trustees committees on Financial Policy and Educational Policy.

HELENA SILVERSTEIN, Thomas Roy and Lura Forrest Jones Professor of Government and Law, has been a member of the faculty for 34 years.

She earned a Bachelor of Arts in political science and economics from University of Pennsylvania, and her master's and doctoral degrees from University of Washington. She joined the faculty as assistant professor in 1992, was tenured and promoted to associate professor in 1998, and was promoted to professor in 2006. She served as head of the Department of Government and Law from 2007 to 2025.

Silverstein is an expert in law and society, law and social movements, and constitutional law. She has a strong teaching record with laudable contributions at all levels of the curriculum, demonstrating excellence as a goal for her students and focusing on robust student engagement. Silverstein, a specialist in legal and political studies, has been an effective adviser, resource, and mentor to countless students. She modeled a deep commitment to social justice and equity, and inspired students to believe in the power of ideas to drive change.

Silverstein is the author of four books, including a textbook on the Supreme Court. A prolific scholar, she has also published several articles, book reviews, and essays at prestigious journals and is a sought-after speaker for invited talks and conference presentations. Exemplifying her commitment as a teacher-scholar, Silverstein mentored numerous EXCEL Scholars in her research projects. That she maintained a consistent record of scholarship and publication, in addition to her dedicated teaching, mentoring, and service, speaks volumes about her extraordinary scholarly and intellectual capacity as well as her organizational and managerial skills.

Silverstein has been a significant and respected leader in the department, College, and her profession. As department head for 18 years, she recruited and mentored nearly two dozen faculty. She has initiated changes in department culture and norms, spending several of her early years at the College as the sole female faculty member in government and law. Silverstein served on many committees, including the Institutional Review Board, Athletics Committee, Appeal and Grievance Committee, and Promotion, Tenure, and Review Committee. She also chaired the Faculty Compensation Committee, Governance Committee, Strategic Plan Steering Committee, and Student Conduct Committee. Reflecting her wide impact and reputation in her scholarly fields, she served as the program director of the Law and Social Sciences Program for the National Science

Foundation for two years (2014-16), where she managed and administered a \$5.5 million federal grant program. She has been a regular proposal reviewer for NSF, an article and manuscript reviewer, an external reviewer for tenure and promotion cases, and a curriculum reviewer for the AP College Board's U.S. government curriculum. She has held distinguished positions in her field, including as review essays editor for the *Law & Society Review*, chair of the Dissertation Award Committee for the Law and Society Association, and member of the Nominations Committee for the American Political Science Association.

HANNAH W. STEWART-GAMBINO, professor of government and law and international affairs, has been a member of the faculty for 19 years.

She earned a Bachelor of Arts in political science and religious studies from Converse College, and her master's and doctoral degree from Duke University. She was appointed dean of the College in 2007 and maintained the role until 2013, when she transitioned to a full-time faculty role, holding a joint position as professor of government and law and international affairs.

Throughout her time as dean, Stewart-Gambino was instrumental in advancing initiatives in the Lafayette curriculum, including a revised Common Course of Study, a new office for Study Abroad, effective use of technology and data, and the adoption of strategic planning tools and methodologies. Her leadership was crucial to the success of the Laf360 initiative, along with her contributions to the IDEAL Center and the Center for Community Engagement.

Stewart-Gambino developed and regularly taught courses on gender and development, globalization, the politics of Brexit, U.S.-Latin American relations, and a First-Year Seminar titled "Feeding the World." She directed winter term programs to multiple countries and acted as the resident faculty director for Lafayette in London and Lafayette in Bonn, Germany. Stewart-Gambino has consistently managed a substantial advising load and has supervised honors theses and EXCEL Scholars. She is an enthusiastic and exceptionally effective educator, whose wide-ranging multitude of interests allows her to fully embrace the teacher-scholar role.

Stewart-Gambino is the author or editor of four volumes and dozens of peer-reviewed articles related to politics and religion in Latin America. She has published in additional areas of strategic planning, curricular development, and higher education administration.

She has been an active member of the department, program, College, and her profession, and has exhibited an exceptional record of leadership. She has served on the International Affairs Advisory Committee; Center for Community Engagement Advisory Committee; Promotion, Tenure, and Review Committee; and Faculty Academic Policy Committee, and played an important role as director of the Lehigh Valley Research Consortium. She has served as vice chair of the board for the Society of College and University Planners, and as strategic planning consultant for the National Endowment for the Humanities and Monmouth University.

NANCY MCCREARY WATERS, associate professor of biology, has been a member of the faculty for 41 years.

Waters earned a Bachelor of Science in biology from St. Francis College and a Ph.D. in biology from University of Notre Dame. She joined the faculty as the first tenure-track woman assistant professor in 1985. After a research leave in 1989 with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, she was tenured and promoted to associate professor in 1993.

She received the Superior Teaching Award for the first time in 1988—being the first woman to do so in science/engineering—and in 1990, 1993, and 2022. Also a recipient of the Gateway Career Center Faculty Career Connector Award and a Marquis Distinguished Teaching Award, Waters shared in the Biology Department's James Crawford Award and most recently received the Ilan Peleg Excellence in Faculty Mentoring Award.

Waters has taught a multitude of courses across the biology curriculum, introducing the first course in ecology, as well as classes in environmental biology, pharmaceutical science and ethics, botany, and biodiversity, among others. Her classes were noteworthy in providing fieldwork laboratories at a time when they were the exception in the department. Her Limnology/Advanced Aquatic Ecology course gained notoriety as "The Boat Course" with a successful 2009 McCutchen Foundation grant to support a floating laboratory. The number of students Waters has impacted across four decades at the College includes not only those in her regular well-enrolled class rotation, but also more than 20 advisees per semester in biology, additional advisees associated with her leading of the Health Professions Advisory Committee, independent study students, summer research experiences, and Science Horizons mentees. Waters' students leave the College with her thoughtful guidance and gentle humanity impacting their professional development in ways they deeply enjoy. Her efforts as chair of the Health Professions Advisory Committee have been the backbone that supports student success in their health professional graduate education and meaningful careers beyond.

Waters' research has positively impacted her teaching, introducing scholarship directly into her courses through Course-Based Undergraduate Research Experiences (CURE projects). She has participated in professional conferences and submitted multiple grants, completing dozens of publications and presentations during her tenure at the College. Mentoring the late David M. Nalven '88 on her successful NSF grant, Waters was instrumental in the establishment and ongoing success of the Summer Research

Fellowship in Nalven's memory, which has now supported over six dozen Lafayette students. This contribution of positive and constructive service to benefit student well-being and support the academic community has been a hallmark of Waters' academic career. From workshops to summer programs, from performance and collaboration with the theater and music arts to notable service on faculty, administrative, and Board of Trustee committees, Waters has sought conventional and creative ways to help students succeed both while at Lafayette and while navigating their lives post-Lafayette.

TODD A. WEY, associate professor of electrical and computer engineering, has been a member of the faculty for 22 years.

He earned a Bachelor of Science from Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology, master's from University of Texas at Dallas, and doctoral degree from Purdue University. He joined the faculty as an assistant professor in 2004, and was tenured and promoted to associate professor in 2011.

Wey has taught a diverse range of courses and laboratories, concentrating on analog electronics, electrical circuits, and senior design within the Electrical and Computer Engineering Department. Wey consistently enhances his courses by incorporating pedagogical innovations, such as adding immersive printed circuit board experiences and redesigning the junior electronics course sequence. He has been the academic adviser for approximately 15-20 students each year, and has guided both honors theses and independent study students. Wey's dedication to student learning is evident, as he prioritizes providing a hands-on learning experience to his students.

Wey's research focus at the College has been in the application of emerging new microelectronics devices and technologies. He has made notable contributions to the field of microelectronics, holds two patents, has published 26 peer-reviewed journal publications, and actively presents at conferences.

Beyond departmental responsibilities, Wey has contributed to his department by leading laboratory space renovations and conducting course assessments for ABET accreditation. For the College, Wey has served on the Faculty Compensation Committee, Health Professions Advisory Committee, Student Conduct Committee, and Engineering/International Studies Advisory Committee. For the profession, he is a member of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers and has served as an invited manuscript reviewer for several journals in his field.

RETIRING TRUSTEES ELECTED TO EMERITUS STATUS

HARRY S. CHERKEN JR. '71, retired partner at Faegre Drinker Biddle & Reath LLP, served as a trustee from 2015 to 2025.

Cherken attended Villanova University School of Law, where he was a member of the law review after graduating from Lafayette with a degree in economics. He subsequently received a master's in liberal arts from University of Pennsylvania. Cherken retired as a partner from Faegre Drinker Biddle & Reath LLP, a Philadelphia-based international law firm where he served as a managing partner and chair of its real estate department for many years. He continues to serve on the boards of Urban Outfitters Inc. and Perpay Inc., and remains active in philanthropy in Philadelphia and beyond, now or previously serving on the boards of the Library Company of Philadelphia, Reading Terminal Market Preservation Fund, Armenian Assembly of America, Howard Karagheusian Commemorative Corp., Woodmere Art Museum, and more. He currently is the Honorary Consul of the Republic of Armenia to the greater Philadelphia area. He established an endowed fund at Lafayette during his tenure and is a member of the Société d'Honneur.

HAROLD N. KAMINE '78, P'04,'07,'11, CEO and owner of Kamine Development Corp., served as a trustee from 2000 to 2025.

At Lafayette, Kamine studied mechanical engineering and was an Academic All-American baseball player. As CEO and owner of the Kamine Development Corp. for over 40 years, Kamine was heavily involved in building and operating large infrastructure businesses, including independent power generation, solar energy, telecommunications and a national data platform, and recycling technologies. Now, he and his sons are building and owning AI data centers, as well as advanced fiber technologies and energy projects involved in data centers. Kamine and his wife, fellow Leopard Kathleen Coogan Kamine '78, have been instrumental in the building of several structures on Lafayette's campus, including Kamine Hall, Kamine Baseball Stadium and Kamine Varsity House at Metzgar Campus, and the Kamine Gymnasium at Kirby Sports Center. His three children, Michelle '04, Matthew '07, and Justin '11, have all graduated from the College.

JUDSON C. LINVILLE '79, P'13,'18, retired senior adviser of General Atlantic, served as a trustee from 2010 to 2025.

After graduating with a degree in psychology while playing on the men's lacrosse team, Linville continued his education at Drexel University's College of Medicine, where he earned his doctorate in psychology. He then spent more than 20 years working for American Express, his last role as president and CEO of Consumer Services. He then moved to Citigroup, where he was chief executive officer of global cards and consumer services for the global credit card franchise, overseeing 55 million customers. He recently left General Atlantic, a private equity firm, where he has been since 2019 as a senior adviser. Linville and his wife, Cynthia Oaks Linville '80, have been supporters of the College's athletic programs, including the men's and women's lacrosse teams and the Leopard Champions Fund athletic scholarship, the Wallach Center, and Gummerson Grounds, as well as the Annual Fund and the President's Challenge for Financial Aid. Together, they have been members of Société d'Honneur since 2015. Linville was recognized with the George Washington Kidd award in 2009. He served as chair of the Educational Policy Committee for eight years.

PAMELA S. PASSMAN '83, global chair, corporate advisory, for APCO Worldwide, served as a trustee from 2015 to 2025.

Passman has served on the Student Life (chair), Educational Policy, Audit, Compensation, and Executive committees. She earned her law degree from University of Virginia after graduating from Lafayette with a degree in government and law. She practiced law in Washington, D.C., with Covington and Burling and also practiced in Tokyo, Japan, before joining Microsoft, first in Tokyo, Japan, and then in Redmond, Wash. Passman became Microsoft's corporate vice president and deputy general counsel, Global Corporate and Regulatory Affairs. She currently serves as global chair, corporate advisory, for the global advisory and advocacy firm APCO Worldwide, based in New York City. Passman serves on the board of Kinaxis Inc. and chairs its Nominations and Governance Committee. She also chairs the board of the children's immigrant rights organization Kids in Need of Defense (KIND).

CANDIDATE FOR HONORARY DEGREE

AUDREY FLACK was a trailblazing woman artist who continually advanced her work and creativity to challenge the boundaries of the American art scene. Professionally active until the days before her death, Flack died in 2024 at age 93.

Flack earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts from Yale University and studied art history at New York University Institute of Fine Arts. She received a graduate and an honorary doctoral degree from Cooper Union in New York City. In May 2015, she received an honorary Doctor of Fine Arts from Clark University.

Starting as an abstract expressionist in the 1950s, Flack evolved into new realism and was the first photorealist painter to be added to the collection at the Museum of Modern Art in the 1960s. For 20 years, she was widely known for her work in the medium until she shifted into sculpture in the 1980s. She was also a writer who shared her stories and thoughts through essays and a personal memoir.

Flack was one of the first women to be included in the third volume of *Janson's History of Art* in 1986, with early volumes of the text devoted only to male artists. She was an honorary vice president of the National Association of Women Artists. While facing early gender barriers and often sexist reviews, she would not stray from her feminine and feminist subject matters.

In line with her art and focus, in 2015, when Flack served as Lafayette College's Richard A. and Rissa W. Grossman Visiting Artist, she took notice of the predominant campus imagery of the Marquis de Lafayette. She voiced that Adrienne, the wife of the College's namesake—who supported Lafayette's ambitions and endured hardship and personal loss with great dignity during the French Revolution—might also be represented. This inspiration ultimately led to a commission for the College's Bicentennial.

The commission would prove historic. Following her experience executing larger-than-life-sized bronze sculptures of female goddesses—including Athena, Daphne, and Medusa—Flack began work on a prototype of a detailed bust of Adrienne. She completed the maquette just days before her death, and it will be known as her last major work. The final 350-pound sculpture was installed outside of Skillman Library and unveiled and dedicated during the Conference of the Council of Lafayette Women on March 7, 2026.

Flack's art and legacy remain displayed at major museums, including the Museum of Modern Art, Metropolitan Museum of Art, Smithsonian American Art Museum, Whitney Museum of American Art, and Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum.

COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

ARTHUR C. BROOKS is a university professor, bestselling author, and one of the world's leading experts on happiness.

Brooks teaches courses on leadership and happiness. He is the author of 16 books, including No. 1 *New York Times* bestsellers *Build the Life You Want* (2023), co-authored with Oprah Winfrey, and *From Strength to Strength: Finding Success, Happiness, and Deep Purpose in the Second Half of Life*. His latest book, *The Meaning of Your Life*, was released in March 2026 and offers practical, evidence-based strategies for breaking free of the powerful trends and personal habits that dull the focus on the purpose of life.

Brooks joined CBS' *The Free Press* earlier this year with a new weekly column, "The Pursuit of Happiness," which

grapples with how today's greatest moral questions impact our sense of meaning, purpose, and joy—and provides data-driven insights on how to achieve a good life in the modern world. He is also a *CBS News* contributor and host of the weekly podcast "Office Hours with Arthur Brooks."

Brooks appears in the media and travels the world to teach people in private companies, universities, public agencies, and faith communities how they can live happier lives and bring greater well-being to others.

Brooks writes in his inaugural column at *The Free Press*, "I feel I have a sacred vocation: to lift others up and bring them together. We all must work on our own happiness, but that project is best and most joyfully done together."

GEORGE WHARTON PEPPER PRIZE RECIPIENT

The 2026 George Wharton Pepper Prize, given annually to the senior “who most closely resembles the Lafayette ideal,” has been voted upon by students and members of the faculty and administration, and awarded to Dexter Kennedy '26.

The spaces in which Kennedy has had an impact are far-reaching. Kennedy, who uses a wheelchair as a result of an injury in 2021, has used his talent for relationship-building to advocate for improved accessibility, both on campus and during his two experiences studying abroad. His first semester at Lafayette, Kennedy emailed President Nicole Hurd to set up a meeting, and that initial conversation has led to a series of discussions with President Hurd and other members of senior leadership about improving campus infrastructure for students with disabilities.

As a psychology and art history double major, personal connection is a common thread of Kennedy's experience. While his original ambition to be a therapist has shifted during his education, his talents for listening, engaging, and inspiring stay strong, most notably with the international student community.

Kennedy got involved in the International Students Association (ISA), eventually becoming a Conversation PARDner and English for Academic Purposes (EAP) mentor to help improve English skills, as well as a Global Ambassador for study abroad. He is also a member of the

Chorduroys a capella group, and has participated in Salsa Club and a variety of other extracurriculars.

Now, he's planning to pursue a master's degree in international education at New York University after graduation. While life in New York City will be an adjustment, Kennedy is excited to take the risk. The opportunity to study abroad during his time at Lafayette, once in London for an interim trip and again in Amsterdam, helped build his confidence. During his time abroad, he began working on advocacy centered around inclusive travel and disability awareness.

His talent for building true connection has been the undercurrent of Kennedy's life. Whether it came in the form of support from his family and hometown after his injury, the mentorship of faculty and staff across Lafayette's campus, or the welcoming embrace of his fellow students, Kennedy continues to forge a path of openness and understanding wherever he goes. “So many people just need to be listened to. I try to be that person for others,” he says.

Kennedy's experience at Lafayette is a testament to the opportunities available to anyone who is willing to take a risk and embrace vulnerability. “You can cultivate any relationship, cultivate any connection, cultivate any experience if you put in the effort, attention, care, and time,” he says.

NOTES ON THE CEREMONY

THE PROCESSIONAL MACE

The tradition of the mace in the academic ceremony is the result of a long evolution. From the 11th to the early part of the 16th century, the mace (derived from the French *masse*) was a short wooden club used in hand-to-hand combat. Commonly, medieval monarchs were protected by trusted sergeants-at-arms who carried maces, and in courtly surroundings the weapon soon came to be regarded as a royal symbol. Often, it was richly decorated with engraved silver and gold ornamentation, such as the royal seal and coat of arms.

Today, the mace is a symbol of the sovereignty of the College and, at Lafayette, is carried by the faculty member senior in rank of full professor in the academic procession opening the annual Commencement Exercises.

The processional mace used in today's ceremony was presented to the College in 1954 as a gift of the Class of 1904. Designed by Frederick K. Detwiller, a member of the 1904 class and artist-in-residence at Lafayette from 1948 until his death in 1953, the intricate ornamentation was executed in silver by Tiffany and Company. The head of the mace forms a loving cup engraved on one side with the coat of arms of the Marquis de Lafayette, and on the other with the College Seal. On the seal is a portrait of the young Lafayette and the College motto, *Veritas liberabit* ("The truth shall make you free"). The mace is topped by 12 scrollwork flanges, symbolic reminders of the sharp iron blades that barbed the head of the original battle weapon.

The Dean of the Faculty carries an elaborately carved wooden mace that, like the processional mace, was first used at Commencement in 1954. A gift of Gottfried Eypeltauer, an Austrian exchange student who attended Lafayette in 1950–51, it was carved in Austria and bears the College Seal and the coat of arms of the Marquis de Lafayette.

The other marshals' batons are for the most part made from the stair rail of the house long occupied by Professor Francis A. March. The batons were first carried at the inauguration of President John Henry MacCracken in 1915.

THE ACADEMIC COSTUME

The origin of academic dress can be traced to the medieval university, when robes were often necessary for warmth in the unheated halls where scholarly enclaves gathered. Today, however, the scholar's gown has become a ceremonial symbol of academic distinction.

In the United States, formal guidelines for academic dress were initiated in 1895 at a national conference of educational leaders hosted by Columbia University. Perceiving the need to determine a common set of practices among the rapidly increasing number of American colleges and universities, representatives formed an Intercollegiate Code on academic dress. Revised in 1932 and 1959, the Intercollegiate Code still provides the descriptive guidelines for interpreting ceremonial dress at an academic convocation today.

By stipulating design and color variations in the ceremonial robe, the Code provides a system to distinguish the academic degree, institution, and field of study of the wearer. The traditional robe is black, but at some institutions earning a doctorate carries with it the privilege of wearing a robe in the institutional color.

Degree: The shape and size of the hood and the design of the sleeves indicate the academic degree of the wearer.

- Bachelor's Degree: Pointed sleeves; usually without hood
- Master's Degree: Long, closed sleeves with arm slits; narrow hood
- Doctor's Degree: Bell-shaped sleeves; broad, draped hood

Institution: The color of the lining of the hood denotes the college or university by which the degree was conferred. A partial list of degree-granting institutions is included here:

- Lafayette: Maroon and white
- Carnegie Mellon: Tartan
- Chicago: Maroon
- Columbia: Blue and white
- Duke: Blue and white
- Harvard: Crimson
- Johns Hopkins: Old gold and sable

- Yale: Blue

Field of Study: The color of the hood facing identifies the field of study in which the academic degree has been conferred.

- Orange: Engineering
- Brown: Fine Arts
- Green: Medicine
- Copper: Economics
